Course Description

This will be a 16 hour hair braiding course consisting of: 5 hours of HIV/AIDS and other communicable diseases, 5 hours of Sanitation and Sterilization, 4 hours on the Diseases and Disorders of the scalp, and 2 hours regarding the laws and rules of the board which affect and govern the practice of hair braiding.

Course Objective

At the conclusion of this 16-hour Course...
students will understand the rules and laws that govern hair braiding.

Enrollment Requirements

All students must:

- be at least 16 years of age or older.
- have a high school diploma
- If still in high school, must show proof of enrollment and a 2.0 Grade Point Average (GPA)
- Provide a copy of Social Security Card
- Provide a copy of a Valid Photo ID—State Issued ID only
- Provide a copy of High School Diploma/GED
- Provide a complete and accurate application

If student is not in high school, does not possess a GED or high school diploma, he or she must take a placement test and score on an 8th grade level.

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Course Objectives

HIV/AIDS

1. The causes of HIV/AIDS, hepatitis, tuberculosis, and other communicable diseases and how these diseases are spread;

3. How to avoid contamination from the diseases in the practice of hair braiding.

Sanitation and Sterilization

1. Universal sanitation and sterilization precautions;
2. How to distinguish between disinfectants and antiseptics and
3. How to sanitize hands and disinfect tools used in the practice of hair braiding.

Diseases and Disorders of the Scalp

1. Disorders and diseases of the scalp and how to distinguish between them; and
2. When hair braiding services can be performed on a client with disorders and diseases of the scalp.

Laws and Rules

1. The laws and rules of the Board that protect the health, safety, and welfare of the consumer.
2. The laws and rules of the Board that determine where and when an individual may legally practice hair braiding.
3. The function of the Board of Cosmetology, how its members are appointed, and their duties.
4. The laws and rules of the Board which specify prohibited conduct, and the penalties for failure to follow the laws and rules.
5. The dates, fees, and requirements for renewal of a hair braiding registration.
